One of the things we talked about would be for the District to donate a literature rack or newcomer packets for their patients. I also made contact with a treatment councilor working for the Salvation Army Next to Jonathan General in Chaska where they have been running a matrix program for meth users and are opening up their program to alcoholics to see what we could do for them. I have heard that they are seeking sponsors/temporary sponsors but so far they haven't gotten back to me. I will keep you posted.

I also have started a new meeting this last month, the Monday Morning 9:00 a.m. As Bill Sees It group at the Five Stars Recovery Center 212 Walnut St. Chaska. So far the meetings have been small and mostly newcomers, opportunities for sponsorship abound. We could use some people with long-term sobriety to start attending; I'm tired of being the only one there without a card to sign!

And lastly I would like to bring up the topic of bargain priced Spanish Big Books. I think the district should get some. I would like for us to send some out to the treatment centers in our area, and to the groups in our area, and have some on hand for future need at \$25 per case, including shipping, limit one case per committee until may1, where it's first come first serve. It's a deal to good to pass up. (We had a vote at the April 7th meeting and the resolution passed.)
